CONFERENCE THEME

The conference theme centres on low cost, rapid methods of environmental restoration as a pathway to food security, economic development and adaptation to climate change. It is particularly pertinent at this time in Timor-Leste as:

- The demand for food, fuel and income has put a tremendous pressure on the vegetation cover.
- The clearing of vegetation and disturbance of the soil has resulted in a high degree of erosion and land degradation.
- In turn, this is resulting in food insecurity and child malnutrition.
- It is a vicious circle we need to change.
